11. Are you willing to serve upon the following conditions provided His Majesty shall so long require your services? 11 Yes
 For the duration of the War, at the end of which you will be discharged with all crested pay. If employed with Hospitals, Depots of Medical Units, and as Clarke etc., you may be retained after the termination of hostilities until your services can be spared, but such retention shall in no case exceed six months.
